DOGS IN SCHOOL GROUNDS

It is great to see parents walking their dogs to school however when entering the school we have people in our school who are allergic and or frightened by dogs. If you are walking your dog to school please keep them away from crowded areas and classrooms. This may mean you ask your children to meet you in an open area in the school at the end of the day and drop your child/ren off at the same place and then your child/ren walk to their classrooms.

USE OF TOILETS IN THE SCHOOL

For safety reasons parents are not permitted to use the students' toilets while waiting at the end of the day or when dropping your children off in the morning. If you need to need to use a toilet, please come to the office and we will point you to an appropriate toilet.

ATTENDANCE

Going to school every day is important for a student's education. This may seem to be stating something extremely obvious, but absence from school means that learning opportunities are reduced, and this can ultimately lead to poorer student achievement. When this happens, the impact will be felt long after the student has left school.

20% OF STUDENTS HAVE HAD MORE THAN 3 DAYS OFF SO FAR THIS YEAR



GRADE 6 PUBERTY

Our grade 6 students have commenced their Puberty Education for 2024. This involves four sessions within their classrooms, led by Kimberly Thomas from Totally Random Education, who is a trained nurse and teacher and who has been providing puberty education for 14 years.

SMART Spelling



Students will now be bringing home their weekly SMART Spelling words, including BOB Words to practise and learn. What exactly are BOB Words?

BOB stands for 'Back of Book'.

As students complete work in their classrooms, teachers will notice words that need further practice or are High Frequency Words that we use often in our everyday interactions. These words are written in the back of the students SMART Spelling book to be added to their weekly practice lists..

Please support your childs spelling development by:

- Encouraging nightly practice of spelling words by writing, sounding and saying their words.
- Challenge students with a family quiz.
- Ask students the meaning of their words or to use them in a sentence.

Don't forget to check in with students each Friday afternoon to see how they went on their partner spelling test and dictation!

Mathletics

Students are now able to access their Mathletics accounts at home.

It has been amazing to see the number of students who have already logged in to practise their Mathematics skills.

This is a great resource to support students with their recall of number facts and practise the skills and concepts they are learning at school. Mathletics is also open to students of all ages.
