## SCHOOL CROSSING AND DROPPING STUDENTS OFF


It is important that when students are arriving and leaving they use the crossings provided for their safety. Parents / guardians walking their children to and from school are asked to provide a good example by using the crossings as well. When children are being dropped off, parking near a school crossing outside the designated parking bays is dangerous and illegal.



Also I have been made aware that the parking supervisors are going to be targeting the parking around Leopold Primary School on a regular basis, both morning and night, so please make sure you are obeying the parking limitations as set out on the parking signs.

### **SPEED ZONES**

With the 2024 school year now formally commenced, it is an opportune time for school communities to be reminded of the importance of road safety around schools.





#### CARS AND YOUNG CHILDREN

Parents and/or guardians are reminded that on hot days it is important never to leave children alone in a car. Temperatures inside a parked car during summer can be around 20 to 30 degrees hotter than the outside temperature. Leaving children in hot cars, even for a moment, can result in serious injury or death. Young children's smaller body size and underdeveloped nervous system places them at a much greater risk of life-threatening heatstroke, dehydration and other serious health risks. If a parent or guardian is travelling with a child, never leave them alone in a parked car, not even for one moment.

#### **MOBILE PHONE POLICY**

A few years a go there was a new mobile phone policy introduced for all government schools. The policy means phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely during the school day.

The aim of this policy is to provide:

- a safe environment to learn without inappropriate mobile phone use (including cyberbullying) or distractions
- greater opportunities for social interaction and physical activity during recess and lunchtimes.

The use of technology is important, but the risks and benefits from its use need to be managed.

In emergencies, parents can contact their children through the school office.

## Student accident insurance, ambulance cover arrangements and private property brought to school

Leopold Primary School does not have whole of school student accident insurance cover.

Parents/carers of students, who do not have student accident insurance, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs; Parents/carers can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers.

Leopold Primary School/Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.

## HELPING TOMORROW'S LITTLE ANGLERS GET HOOKED ON FISHING



Last year the Victorian Government wanted to provide the next generation of recreational fishers the opportunity to get hooked on fishing, with free Little Angler Kits for kids across Victoria. The Minister for Outdoor Recreation announced back in June 2023 that 60,000 kits would be made available to grade five primary students in more than 1,900 Victorian schools later that year. The kits would set families up with everything they need to wet a line including a fishing rod and reel, line, tackle box, some tackle, and a Kids' Guide to Fishing that includes information and links to educational resources to learn the basics such as fishing safety, knots, and rigs. The kits help youngsters get active, learn about the aquatic environment, and have fun in the great outdoors whether they be down the coast, on Port Phillip Bay, or by a river in regional Victoria.

The kits have arrived at school, and although the students are now in grade 6, we wanted to ensure they were given to the students they were intended for.

Therefore, this afternoon all grade 6 child will come home with a "Little Anglers Kit" for them to begin their fishing journey and have some fun in our local waterways.

## **ENGLISH** \ ONLINE INTERVIEW

Over the past two days, our new prep students have been meeting with their teachers to get to know each other and to complete module 1 of the English On Line literacy sessions. The students have done an amazing job before commencing their first day today.

Now it is the grade 1's turn. Over the next week, all grade 1 students will be completing module 2 of the English On Line Interview. This is a requirement by the Department of Education. The students will be working with either Mr. Sharkey or Ms. McKay, with the sessions estimated to go for 30 minutes per student.



Tutoring for 2024 will commence next week. Our three tutors, Vicky McKay, Rita Nolan and Lee-Anne McDermot will be starting to assess students in the area of phonics, decoding, and fluency to determine the students who will be undertaking tutoring in semester 1.

Families whose child/ren are on the tutoring program will receive an email from one of the above tutors introducing themselves and explaining the what student will be completing in tutoring lessons.

## I Spy

## Make it Fun

## Create

Use reading to inspire drawings or new stories.

## Be Seen

Make sure you are seen reading. Keep books magazines at easy reach.

## Go Online

Look online & in app stores for appropriate word & spelling games.

## Get Out

Go to your public library regularly. Find the books you loved as a kid to read together.

## Make Space

Have a special place or a certain time when you read together.

## Read everything out loud.
