

DIABETES AT LPS


At LPS we have three trained staff that look after students with type 1 diabetes. These staff have all been trained to ensure the students are safe.

ATTITUDE TO SCHOOL SURVEY

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of their school.

The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

This year, the AtoSS will be conducted during this week and next week.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

Young people enjoy having a say! This survey has been running for nearly 20 years and is invaluable in helping schools understand student views to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. The survey responses also help the Department of Education understand how student's learning experiences can be improved.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD BE ASKED TO DO?

Your child will be invited to complete the survey **online during class time** using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. The survey will take around 20-45 minutes to complete.

HOW IS MY CHILD'S CONFIDENTIALITY PROTECTED?

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey from their teacher. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. Personally identifiable data will not be recorded in the survey response file to ensure the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

HOW WILL RESULTS BE REPORTED?

The survey results will be reported back to the school in aggregate form throughout the survey period. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

We will share the results of the survey with parents, in documents such as the School Annual Report.

Grade 3/4 Healthy Heroes Incursion



On Monday the 8th May, Mark O'Connor, Toby Conway and Kate Brody from the Geelong Cats AFL & AFLW teams, came to talk to the grade 3/4s about being healthy.

They talked about eating healthy, being active, staying hydrated, getting enough sleep and screen time. We learnt to drink 7 cups of water a day, be active for an hour each day and eat 2 servings of fruit and 5 servings of vegetables. They also talked about sleeping for 9-11 hours every night and aiming for a maximum of 2 hours of screen time every day. We really enjoyed the incursion and hope we do it again.

Student accident insurance, ambulance cover arrangements and private property brought to school

Leopold Primary School does not have whole of school student accident insurance cover.

Parents/carers of students, who do not have student accident insurance, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs; Parents/carers can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers.

Leopold Primary School/Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.


