LEOPOLD PRIMARY SCHOOL REVIEW UPDATE


On Tuesday 1st and Wednesday 2nd of August we had the 4 external members of the review panel, Kim Ryan, Alan Davis, Vicky Long and Tim Callaghan, explore the following Terms of Reference with Parents, Students and Staff.

- To what extent does the school analyse data and use the curriculum and instructional model to inform teaching, learning, and assessment practices to differentiate and target learning to ensure student achievement and growth through an engaging curriculum.
- To what extent are the school's operations, structures, and practices effective in implementing the school's vision and values to enable future school improvement.
- To what extent does the school effectively engage with and leverage school community connections and partnerships.

The outcomes of the 2 days were extremely positive and there was a lot to celebrate being part of the LPS Family. The last day of the Review is this Monday August 14 and from this day a report will be written to guide the next 4 years at LPS. Thank you to everyone that contributed to the feedback over the 2 fieldwork days and we are looking forward to receiving the report after next week.



INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND TO COMMENCE SOON


It is with great excitement that I can now inform the LPS Family that the Inclusive Playground works will commence on August 29th 2023. There will be an area behind the grade 1 portable classrooms allocated to storage for the work site and will be fenced off by temporary fencing. I am sure the students will enjoy watching what is going on inside the fencing.

Last year we received \$178 480 as part of the 2021-22 State Budget from Victorian Government to build an inclusive playground at Leopold Primary School. Due to the increased prices of labour and parts, School Council are also

contributing approximately \$72 000 to ensure the "dream" was delivered.

PARKING IN PICK UP AND DROP OFF ZONE

I just want to remind parents about the rules of the sign displayed in the pick up and drop off zone on Kensington Rd and Vicarage Rd between the times of 8:30am to 9:30am and 3:00pm to 4:00pm.

No parking signs

If there is a 'no parking' sign, you can stop for 2 minutes in that area:

- if you are picking up or dropping off passengers or goods
- you stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

If you stop in, or partly in, an area showing a no parking sign and you are not picking up or dropping off passengers or goods, you are considered to be parked and can be fined. This is the case even if you stay with your vehicle.

Grade 4 Literacy Enrichment Program

Grade 4 students taking part in the Literacy Enrichment Program have been undertaking some amazing work in their studies surrounding King Arthur, the middle ages and knights.

These students participate in 2 x 1 hour sessions each week throughout the duration of Term 3. The learning they have been doing has been multimodal and utilises Google Classroom to reflect and extend the students thinking about key concepts.

While undertaking complex reading, students have also developed their own hero, anti-hero and even created their own castles via different mediums including Lego and Minecraft.
