MOBILE PHONE POLICY

A few years a go there was a new mobile phone policy introduced for all government schools. The policy means phones or smart watches (new to the policy at LPS due to the number of interruptions in classrooms as they are being used as mobile devices) brought to school must be switched off and stored securely during the school day. The aim of this policy is to provide:

- a safe environment to learn without inappropriate mobile phone use (including cyberbullying) or distractions
- greater opportunities for social interaction and physical activity during recess and lunchtimes.

The use of technology is important, but the risks and benefits from its use need to be managed. In emergencies, parents can contact their children through the school office.



Students are able to log onto Mathletics at home and explore different components to support them in their mathematical knowledge and practise key numeracy skills.


By working through the different tasks throughout the year the students are able to earn bronze, silver and gold certificates.
