However, 2024 classes are also dependant on student numbers on census day, at the end of February 2024. Dependant on numbers that day, some classes may change due to budgets.


The current plan for number of classes at each grade level for 2024 are:

The 2023 Mallacoota Flathead Challenge requires teams to have a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 4 anglers. Nate entered with his Dad, his Uncle and a family friend. Throughout the competition, claimed fish must be within the legal limit and points are scored from each team's best 10 flathead caught during the challenge.

Over two days, Nate won Best Junior (for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row) and his team came 8<sup>th</sup> out of 110 teams!
