Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer. Within our school this support has allowed us to offer a wider range of subjects and special curriculum experiences, eg: music program and enhanced digital learning opportunities.

Leopold Primary School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents. Please find the contribution schedule for your child's grade attached.

The school has arranged for families to purchase INDIVIDUAL MATERIALS for all of your child's items from Winc. This in an online portal to enable you to purchase materials and contribute to other listed voluntary contributions. Individual booklists may be ordered for each of your children separately and will be delivered to your home free of charge if ordered before the 5th December 2025. We encourage families to take advantage of this option as it also provides students with appropriate and similar requisites. This is one thing less families need to worry about organising for back to school readiness. Orders received after the 5th December will incur a \$12.95 delivery charge and will also be delivered to your home. If you have more than one child, you have the options to order their items altogether so as to incur one delivery charge.

Camps and excursions are payable through the Compass app or BPay. Excursion costing will be published on the Compass app early 2026. Please check if you have any credits before paying.

Refunds

If a camp or excursion is cancelled or altered by the school, or a student is no longer able to attend part or all of the camp or excursion, our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents/carers on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Non-refundable deposits for camps and bus charges for excursions will not be refundable.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

• Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
